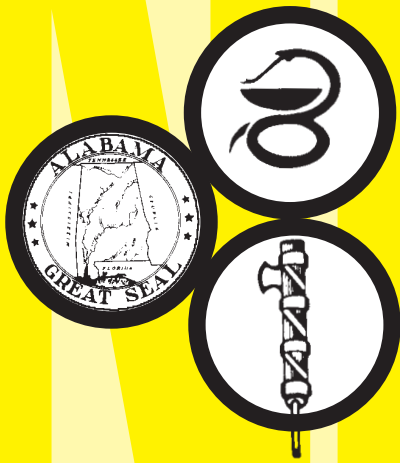

Board of Pharmacy

Roland Nelson has been elected to a five-year term on the Alabama State Board of Pharmacy effective January 1, 2004. He replaces Jim Justice. Roland is the pharmacist and owner of Reynolds Pharmacy in Homewood, where he has worked in an independent community setting for 39 years. He earned a bachelor of science degree in pharmacy from Auburn University in

1964. He has been actively involved in the practice of retail pharmacy since 1964, when he went to work for Reynolds Drugs in Homewood. Roland is past president of the Alabama Pharmacy Association and a member of the following organizations: National Association of Community Pharmacy, American Pharmacists Association, Jefferson County Pharmacy Association, and Professional Compounding Centers of America. He is a certified pharmacist immunizer, a preceptor, and a former member of the Auburn Pharmacy Alumni Board. He has received numerous awards, which include the Department of Transitional Assistance's King Courtesy Award, Knoll's Innovative Pharmacist Award, and the Merck Award.

Article 7, *Compounding of Drugs*, of Title 34, The Practice of Pharmacy Act, became effective September 1, 2003.
