Disciplinary Action

Thomas W. Fisher, RPh #9256 – Case 600. Respondent entered into an Agreed Order with the Board of Pharmacy. He was found guilty of five (5) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act. His license was suspended for five (5) years. The suspension will be stayed on January 1, 2002, and his license will be placed on probation for the remainder of the five years. He was fined a total of \$2,500 and must attend a law seminar in both 2002 and 2003 in addition to his required annual 15 hours of continuing education (CE).

RPh #11834 – Case 603. Respondent entered into an Agreed Order with the Board. She was found guilty of five (5) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act. Her license was suspended for ten (10) years. As of January 1, 2002, her license will be placed on probation for the remainder of the ten years. She was fined a total of \$2,000 and must attend a law seminar in both 2002 and 2003 in addition to the required annual 15 hours of CE. She agreed to attend **live CE** programs for the years 2002 and 2003. No correspondence courses will be accepted. She shall enter into an inpatient impaired treatment program for a minimum of 21 days. She shall enter into a contract with Oklahoma Pharmacists Helping Pharmacists (OPHP).

RPh #12462 – Case 602. Respondent was found guilty of six (6) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act. His

license was suspended for ten (10) years. He may appear before the Board to request probation after one year of documented sobriety. He was fined a total of \$1,500.

Toni Hines Cappellaro, Technician #2891 – Case 604. Respondent was found guilty on three (3) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act. She was fined a total of \$500 and her pharmacy technician permit was revoked.

RPh #10013 – Case 598. Respondent entered into an Agreed Order with the Board. He was found guilty on twelve (12) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act. His license was suspended for ten (10) years. He may appear before the Board to request probation after one year of documented sobriety. He was fined a total of \$3,000. He shall enter into an outpatient substance abuse treatment with the St Anthony Rehabilitation Treatment program at St Anthony's Hospital with Dr Tom Davis. He shall enter into a contract with OPHP.

Disciplinary Action

Jody Johnson, Technician #516 – Case 609. Respondent was found guilty on two (2) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act. Her pharmacy technician permit was revoked.

Sharla Redford, Technician #3068 – Case 607. Respondent was found guilty on two (2) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act. Her pharmacy technician permit was revoked.

Clark T. Brown, RPh #9858 – Case 567 and 608. Respondent was found guilty on a motion to revoke the probation of his license in Case 567. He was also found guilty of five (5) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act in Case 608. His pharmacist license was permanently revoked.

Doctor of Pharmacy Certificate

The Board has received almost 1,500 applications for the new Doctor of Pharmacy certificate since November 1. Do not delay sending in your application. The Board will set a deadline for currently licensed pharmacists to apply during the January meeting. Applications are available from the Board office or can be downloaded from the Board Web site.

From the Inspector's Desk

- ◆ **Caution:** Out-of-state physician assistant and nurse practitioner prescriptions are not legal in Oklahoma.
- ◆ Technicians may **not** make photocopies of their permits.
- ◆ If technicians work at more than one location, they must carry their permits with them.
- ◆ A pharmacy that has a technician that works in multiple locations needs to have documentation of training for that technician in **each location**.
- ◆ Physician Assistants **cannot** prescribe C-II medications except in a hospital setting.
- ◆ **Remember:** The Drug Enforcement Administration requires that all controlled dangerous substance invoices must be signed and dated.

Technician Renewals

All technician permits expire January 31, 2002. Please remind your technicians that it is their responsibility to keep their license current whether or not they receive a renewal notice. If a renewal notice is not received because of a change of address or for any other reason, they are still subject to the penalty fee. As of August 15, 2001, the technician fee is \$40.

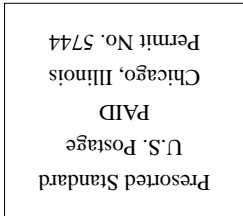
