Reciprocities and Score Transfers

Disciplinary Actions

Michelle Pieratt, Reciprocity Applicant. After hearing information regarding action on her medical license, the Board agreed to approve the reciprocity of Michelle Pieratt. Upon starting work as a pharmacist in Oklahoma, Ms Pieratt will be required to work 250 hours under the supervision of another pharmacist.

Angela Klohn, Technician #5576 – Case 618. Respondent was found guilty on four (4) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act relating to the unauthorized filling of controlled dangerous substance (CDS) prescriptions. She did not appear at the hearing. Her pharmacy technician permit was revoked.

DPH #9756 – Case 617. Respondent entered into an Agreed Order with the Board. She was found guilty of six (6) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act relating to theft of merchandise and the filling or refilling of a dangerous drug prescription without authorization. Her license was suspended for four (4) years beginning March 13, 2002. The suspension was stayed

and her license placed on probation for the remainder of the four years beginning April 1, 2002. She will submit to an evaluation by Oklahoma Pharmacists Helping Pharmacists (OPHP). She was fined a total of \$1,500 and must attend a law seminar in both 2002 and 2003 in addition to the required annual 15 hours of continuing education (CE).

Clark Phillips, DPh #10018 – Case 619. Respondent was found guilty of two (2) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act. Respondent received two (2) warning notices in a 12-month period for failure to remove out-of-date medications from active stock and was referred to the Board for complaint. Respondent was fined a total of \$500 and shall have a letter of reprimand placed in his file for a period of one (1) year.

David Alan Kendrick, DPh #11708 – Case 621. Respondent's Oklahoma license was currently on probation as of February 24, 1999. Respondent was found guilty of five (5) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act. Respondent's Nevada license had been revoked upon the theft of controlled dangerous substances from his employer. The probation of his Oklahoma license was revoked followed by the permanent revocation of his Oklahoma license.

DPH #9879 – Request to Remove Probation. Respondent's license was placed on probation on April 21, 1994. The Board voted to remove the sanctions on his license providing that he continues a modified contract with OPHP for a minimum of two (2) years.

DPH #10121 – Case 610. Respondent entered into an Agreed Order with the Board. He was found guilty of five (5) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act relating to the theft of CDS for personal use. His license was suspended indefinitely. He was fined a total of \$2,500 and may appear before the Board in four years (March 2006) to request probation. Probation will be possible only if respondent is able to show one (1) year of drug-free sobriety.

Terrell Lee Winkler, DPh #8467 – Case 622. Respondent was found guilty of four (4) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act relating to the conviction of felony offenses. Respondent is currently in jail. His Oklahoma pharmacist license was revoked.

Reciprocities and Score Transfers

The following reciprocities and score transfers were accepted into Oklahoma after successfully completing the Jurisprudence Exam: Daniel E. Garcia (Tex), #13023; James Poullard (Tex), #13024; and Stacey Rae Sandell (Kan), #13025.

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Disciplinary Actions

DPh #10776 – Case 624. Respondent was found guilty on two (2) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act relating to the possession of a controlled dangerous substance (CDS) without a valid prescription and non-compliance with his Oklahoma Pharmacists Helping Pharmacists (OPHP) contract. Respondent's license was currently on probation as of January 12, 2000. His license was suspended for ten (10) years until April 25, 2012. The suspension will be placed on probation providing that he shall enter into and abide by a contract with OPHP, he will not handle or have access to CDS in his practice of pharmacy for a minimum of one (1) year, and he will make his employer aware of this order. In addition, he was fined a total of \$1,000. If the respondent has a positive drug test reported to the Board by OPHP, his license will be immediately suspended.

DPh #12437 – Case 623. Respondent was found guilty on four (4) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act relating to the possession of a CDS without a valid prescription and the practice of pharmacy without reasonable skill and safety. His license was suspended for ten (10) years until April 25, 2012. In addition, he was fined a total of \$1,000. He may appear before the Board and request probation upon completion of two (2) years of sobriety.

Angela Meggyes, Technician #4481 – Case 625. Respondent was found guilty of two (2) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act relating to the theft of merchandise and the possession of a CDS without a valid prescription. She did not appear at the hearing. Her pharmacy technician permit was revoked.

DPh #12376 – Request for Probation. Respondent's license was placed on suspension September 23, 1998. The Board voted to place his license on probation providing he completes 150 hours of internship and continues his OPHP contract. His license will remain on probation until April 25, 2007.

Troy Rothoff, Technician #2649 – Case 620. Respondent was found guilty of three (3) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act relating to the theft of merchandise and the possession of a CDS without a valid prescription. He did not appear at the hearing. His pharmacy technician permit was revoked.

Disciplinary Actions

DPh #11364 – Case No. 502. Respondent appeared before the Board upon an "Application to Revoke Probation" for non-compliance with his OPHP contract. His probation was revoked and placed back on the original suspension until June 2007. He may request to appear before the Board to request probation upon completion of ninety (90) days of full compliance under his Oklahoma Pharmacists Helping Pharmacists (OPHP) contract.

From the Inspector's Desk

Remember: Bureau of Narcotics Rule 475:30-1-15 states "pharmacists are required to **obtain positive identification** if they are unsure of the identity of a person picking up a prescription for any controlled dangerous substance." We have had several instances where a patient says they did not receive the medication. Identification with a log may be a good solution.

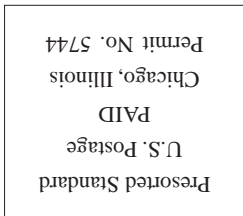
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
